

Subject: Police Commemoration day (October 21, 2016).

In memory of the Police personnel killed on duty, every year 21st October is observed as Police Commemoration Day at all District Headquarters and at other Police units throughout the country. In order to synchronise the ceremony throughout the country, 0800 hours of the day is fixed as the time for commencement of the ceremonial "Smriti Parade". The names of the Police personnel killed on duty during the previous twelve months (September-August) are to be read out during the ceremony.

2. It is, requested, that a rank-wise list of Police personnel of all ranks killed on duty including those, who died owing to hazards of terrain/climate or natural calamities during the period **September 01, 2015 to August 31, 2016** may kindly be sent to us for circulation to all the Police units in the country. Brief circumstances of the death during duty of the Policemen must be highlighted while sending report.

3. It may be mentioned that during the DGSP/IGSP Conference-2015, the Prime Minister had launched a Website (www.police.gov.in) in the name of 'Indian Police in Service of the Nation' to remember Police Martyrs and project good work done by the Police at national level. You may be aware that information about martyrs is already being uploaded on the website (www.police.gov.in) by Police forces of all States/UTs/CAPFs/CPOs. It may kindly be ensured that data on martyrs for the period September 1, 2015-August 31, 2016 is also uploaded on the website as well. IB will extract the list from the data published on the website. Since this will be the first time data on the website is going to be used for the purpose mentioned above, a separate hard copy is also being requested for as per the timeline mentioned below.

4. A list of the personnel of your organisation killed on duty (upto August 31, 2016) may be sent to us by August 31, 2016. Casualties, if any, during the period from August 16 to 31, 2016 may be intimated to us over fastest communication mode available with our Subsidiary Intelligence Bureau located at the State Capitals, latest by **September 08, 2016**. As the information is to be consolidated and circulated to all States and Central

Police Organisations, it may kindly be ensured that the reply is sent to us by the stipulated deadline. A NIL report may also kindly be sent, in case there are no names to report.
