

MINUTES OF MEETING - PROGRESS OF CCTNS IN PUDUCHERRY

Objective: Monitoring the progress of CCTNS project

Points Discussed:

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| 1. | Respected Chief Secretary welcomed all the members and initiated the meeting by enquiring the scope and progress of CCTNS. |
| 2. | Mr. Harikumar of Wipro started the presentation for the day. IT initiatives in Puducherry related to Police department were briefed. |
| 3. | Mr. Gopi Swaminathan of NIC explained the scope of CIPA, its features, current status, infrastructure assessment, reports generated etc in an elaborate manner |
| 4. | Honorable Chief Secretary enquired on the security features of the CIPA application, hosting server, ability of sharing the data entered in CIPA across police stations in Puducherry and sending reports to NCRB |
| 5. | Mr. Gopi Swaminathan explained that all the 38 Police Stations in Puducherry are using CIPA. Security features are strictly enforced and the application can be used only by valid user in each station. All investigation Officers (IO) can modify his own case and the data is replicated in the CRB server. Reports are regularly generated and NCRB will be able to use the reports effectively. An MIS application is also available which can pull data from CIPA application and the information is available in all Police Stations about Crime Data entered in any other police station in Puducherry. |
| 6. | DGP pointed out that he has instructed NIC to add features where Lost Vehicles can be searched for and details if it is found elsewhere can be entered. A link to RTO vehicle data on required fields shall be extended to identify the real owner and vehicle details. Necessary request may be made to RTO authority in this regard. |
| 7. | Chief Secretary enquired if computerized copy of the FIR is provided to the citizens or still the manual method is adopted. |

8	DGP and SSP conferred that the manual method is still used in most stations and a Government Notification /Order needs to be initiated to all police stations and change the current practice.
9	Chief Secretary enquired on the methods of updating a record in CIPA and the role of judiciary in it.
10	Currently, the judicial officers are not accessing the CIPA system. It was discussed that this needs to be changed so that the result of first scrutiny, cases on trial, statuses of each case and number of cases at different stages can be reflected in the system immediately.
11	After the presentation on CIPA was completed, Mr. Harikumar explained the background of CCTNS project, Agencies involved, Committees at the UT, Role of SPMC, SI and SPMU. Timelines for all the stages of the project were also explained.
12	Chief Secretary enquired on the status of the different deliverables at stage 1
13	Mr. Harikumar briefly explained each deliverable and the review method adopted by Wipro in association with the Police Department to submit each deliverable. He also explained the role of SI (System Integrator) and MHA's expectations from the PIM report. Mr Bascarane explained that the Level-I basic computer training program has already started through Puducherry Institute of Cooperative Management, while Level-II will be initiated after customizing the CCTNS application to be developed by NCRB.
14	Chief Secretary premeditated the progress of the project and advised M/S Wipro to continue its good work in co-ordination with the police department and suggested to speed up the completion of PIM report . He also maintained that Puducherry being a smaller union territory in terms of area and population, it should be able to implement the project faster than other State governments in India.
